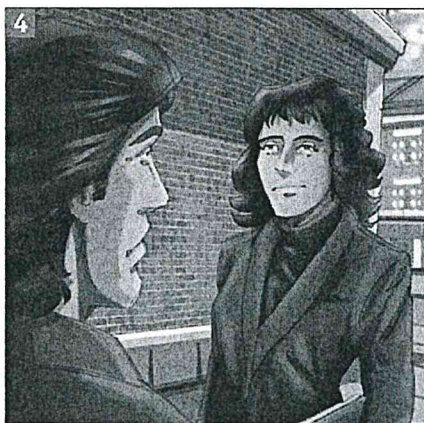
**Peter** Hello, Lucy. You look very smart.

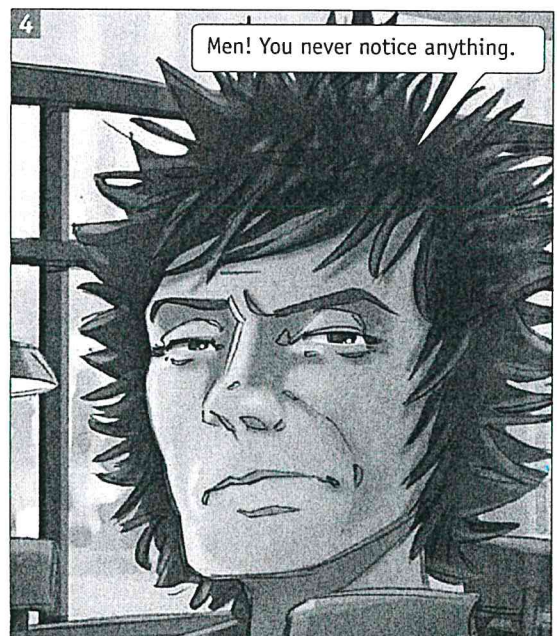
**Ryan** Hello, Peter. How are you?

1 Lucy's got an interview today. It's for a new job at her company – Personal Assistant to the new Director for Europe.

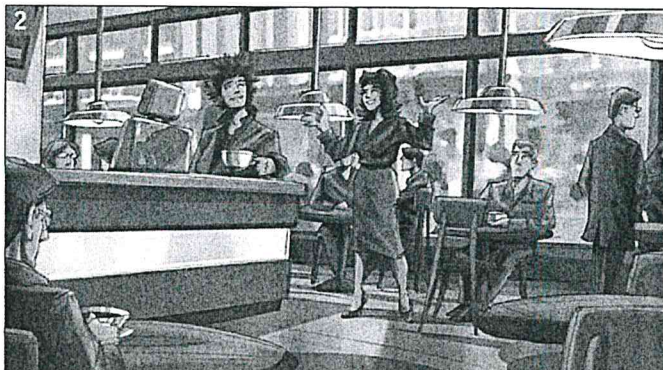


**Chairman** So, Miss Patterson. Please tell us something about your education.

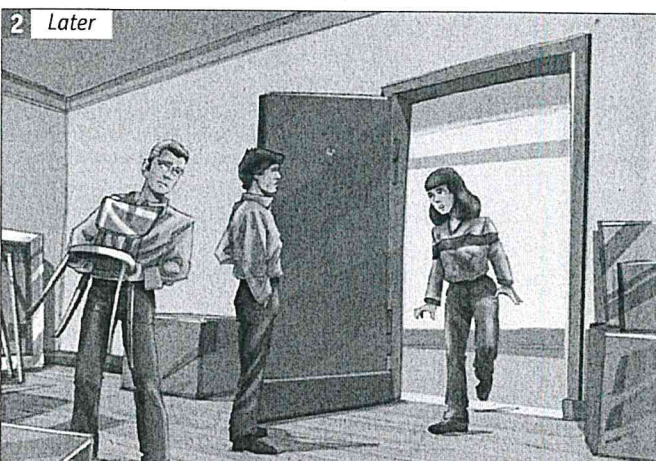

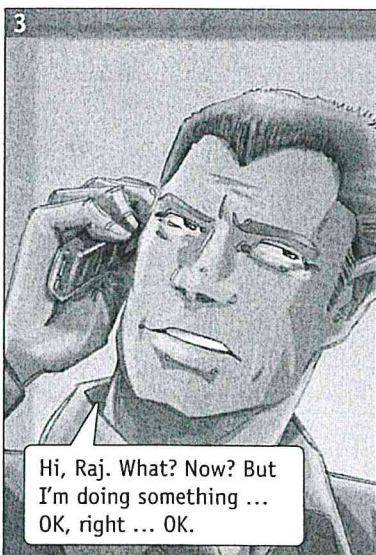

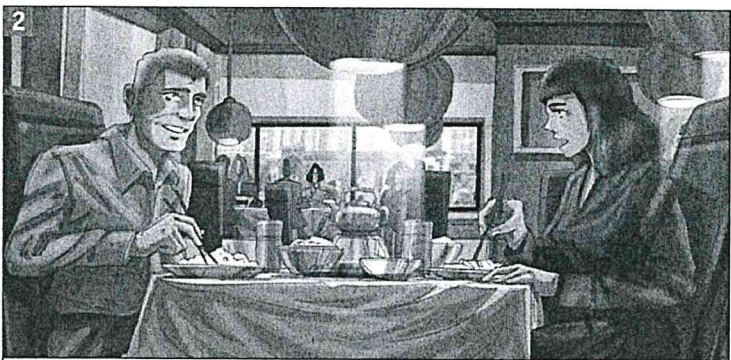
**Sarah** Hi, Jordan. Have you got a date with Lucy this evening?

**Sarah** Yes, they are. And they've both got children. So, I've got nieces and nephews, too.

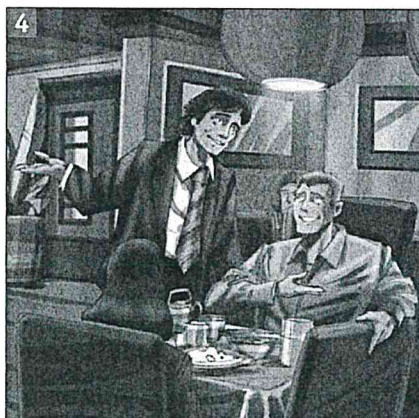


**Jordan** But their Auntie Sarah is still single.
